

HOUSE RULES

Living Messiah Sukkot 2020 at Wilderness Ranch

The following is a combined list of house rules that have been set by campground staff and the leadership of Living Messiah Ministries. Though it is certainly not our intention to over-regulate this festive event, experience has shown us the need for a communal agreement of unity.

Clean-up Regulations:

(These are Wilderness Ranch rules)

1. Kitchen:

- ~~All dishes washed and put away~~
- ~~Stove and griddle cleaned~~
- All counters, tables must be wiped clean
- All floors inside must be swept and mopped
- Outside concrete must be swept
- Refrigerator must be wiped out and all food taken with you
- All trash must be put in dumpster

2. Grounds:

- Trash round grounds must be picked up and put into dumpster
- If you have moved tables & benches, they must be put back in the order you found them
- All logs and stumps for the camp fire must be returned if moved
- If you want a fire, you must check with the camp director to see if the forest rangers have a restriction
- All fires must be in the camp fire pit by the volleyball court

3. Dorms:

- All trash must be put in dumpsters
- All bed mats must be put back on bunks; if you stacked mats, put

them back to one mat per bed

- Floors swept and mopped
- Make sure all curtains and rods are on the windows in the dorm you are in
- Brooms, dust pans, and small trash cans accounted for

4. Bathrooms:

- All trash must be put in dumpster
- Showers sprayed with bleach water
- Toilets sprayed with bleach water
(After spraying down toilets and showers with bleach, a water hose is in the laundry room. You may use it to hose everything off for easy clean up including the floors.)
- Counters and sinks sprayed and wiped off
- Mirrors cleaned
- Toilet paper and paper towels replaced
(Paper supplies are in the laundry room between the 2 bathrooms)

Pets:

1. You are not encouraged to bring your pet due to the inherent dangers in the open forest (predators, raptors, lack of boundaries, etc.) However, if you would like to bring your pet, then you must abide by these rules:
 - Your pet should be generally quiet and well-disciplined, i.e., no excessive barking or jumping on people, especially children.
 - Your pet should be on a leash and not be permitted to wander freely within the campground
 - You **MUST** clean up after your pet.
2. If you have any questions, see someone in leadership.

Alcohol:

1. Camp regulations and the Scriptures themselves allow for the consumption of fermented drink on the campground, within legal parameters.
 - **Ephesians 5:8:** “Do not get drunk with wine, for that is debauchery, but be filled with the Spirit.”
2. You may bring alcoholic beverages with you for your personal use. However, there will be no open drinking in large groups. Be thoughtful of those who may have a different view of this matter than you.

3. The leadership has established a zero tolerance policy on this matter. Anyone who is inebriated according to the judgment of the leadership will be asked to leave the campsite, and will not be permitted to return.
4. No minors are to consume alcohol in accordance with Arizona Revised Statutes, Title 4-241.

Campfires:

1. All fires must be in the camp fire pit by the volleyball court
2. No wood collecting in the park.

Firearms:

Recreational firearms use is not permitted according to Wilderness Ranch rules. However, properly licensed firearms may be carried for personal safety reasons.

Preparation:

Keep in mind Scripture pertaining to the preparation for and guarding of the Shabbat. We will observe three Shabbats; i.e., the first and last days of Sukkot and the weekly Saturday Shabbat. Please try to have dinner prepared by 5:00 - 5:30 p.m. so cleanup can occur while there is still daylight to see by.

Quiet Hours:

Quiet hours are from 10:00 p.m. to 7:00 a.m. Please do not use generators, loud radios, televisions, etc., and avoid noisy behavior during these times.

Visitors:

All visitors at your campsite must be registered campers with Living

Messiah Ministries.

By registering with us, you, your guests, and your household agree to abide by the “**House Rules**” put forth above. We are asking everyone to show respect for one another, and to render honor one towards another, in love. This is the second of the great commandments, and upon it hangs the whole of Torah.
