




Psalm 100

Genesis 37

The Scriptures 1998

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1 And Ya'aqob dwelt in the land of his father's sojournings, in the land of Kena'an.

2 This is the genealogy of Ya'aqob. Yosëph, being seventeen years old, was feeding the flock with his brothers. And the young man was with the sons of Bilhah and the sons of Zilpah, his father's wives. And Yosëph brought an evil report of them to his father.

3 And Yisra'ël loved Yosëph more than all his children, because he was the son of his old age. And he made him a long robe.

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4 But when his brothers saw that their father loved him more than all his brothers, they hated him and were not able to speak peaceably to him.

5 And Yosēph dreamed a dream, and told it to his brothers. So they hated him even more.

6 And he said to them, “Please listen to this dream which I have dreamed:

7 “See, we were binding sheaves in the midst of the field, and see, my sheaf rose up and also stood up. And see, your sheaves stood all around and bowed down to my sheaf.”

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8And his brothers said to him, “Shall you indeed reign over us? Shall you indeed rule over us?” So they hated him even more for his dreams and for his words.

9And he dreamed still another dream and related it to his brothers, and said, “See, I have dreamed another dream, and see, the sun and the moon and the eleven stars bowed down to me.”

10And he related it to his father and his brothers. And his father rebuked him and said to him, “What is this dream that you have dreamed? Shall we, your mother and I and your brothers, indeed come to bow down to the earth before you?”

Genesis 37

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11 And his brothers envied him, but his father guarded the word.

12 And his brothers went to feed their father's flock in Shekem.

13 And Yisra'ēl said to Yosēph, "Are not your brothers feeding the flock in Shekem? Come, I send you to them." So he said to him, "Here I am."

14 And he said to him, "Please go and see if it is well with your brothers and well with the sheep, and bring back word to me." So he sent him out of the Valley of Hebron, and he went to Shekem.

15 And a certain man found him, and see, he was wandering in the field. And the man asked him, saying, "What do you seek?"

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16 And he said, “I am seeking my brothers. Please inform me where they are feeding their sheep.”

17 And the man said, “They have left here, for I heard them say, ‘Let us go towards Dothan.’ ” So Yosēph went after his brothers and found them in Dothan.

18 And they saw him from a distance, and before he came near them, they plotted against him, to kill him.

19 And they said to each other, “See, this master of dreams is coming!

Genesis 37

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20“Now, then, come and let us now kill him and throw him into some pit, and shall say, ‘Some wild beast has devoured him.’ Let us then see what comes of his dreams!”

21But Re’uḇēn heard and rescued him from their hands, and said, “Let us not take his life.”

22And Re’uḇēn said to them, “Shed no blood. Throw him into this pit which is in the wilderness, and do not lay a hand on him” – in order to rescue him out of their hands, and bring him back to his father.

23So it came to be, when Yosēph had come to his brothers, that they stripped Yosēph of his robe, the long robe which was on him.

Genesis 37

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24 And they took him and threw him into a pit. And the pit was empty, there was no water in it.

25 And they sat down to eat a meal. And they lifted their eyes and looked and saw a company of Yishma'ēlites, coming from Gil'ad with their camels, bearing spices, and balm, and myrrh, going to take them down to Mitsrayim.

26 And **Yehudah** said to his brothers, "What would we gain if we kill our brother and conceal his blood?"

27 "Come and let us sell him to the Yishma'ēlites, and let not our hand be upon him, for he is our brother, our flesh." And his brothers listened.

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28 And men, Midyanite traders passed by, so they pulled Yosēph up and lifted him out of the pit, and sold him to the Yishma'ēlites for twenty pieces of silver. And they took Yosēph to Mitsrayim.

29 And Re'ubēn returned to the pit, and see, Yosēph was not in the pit. And he tore his garments.

30 And he returned to his brothers and said, "The boy is gone! And I, where am I to go?"

31 So they took Yosēph's robe, killed a male goat, and dipped the robe in the blood,

32 and sent the long robe and brought it to their father and said, "We have found this. Please look, is it the robe of your son or not?"

Genesis 37

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33 And he recognised it and said, “It is my son’s robe. An evil beast has devoured him. Yosēph is torn, torn to pieces.”

34 And Ya‘aqob tore his garments, and put sackcloth on his waist, and mourned for his son many days.

35 And all his sons and all his daughters arose to comfort him, but he refused to be comforted, and he said, “Now let me go down into the grave to my son in mourning.” So his father wept for him.

36 And the Midanites had sold him in Mitsrayim to Potiphar, an officer of Pharaoh and captain of the guard.


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4 His brothers saw that their father **loved** him more than all his brothers; and so they hated him and could not speak to him on friendly terms.

Genesis 37:5 And when Ioseph had dreamed a dream, he told it to his brothers, **6** and he said to them, “Hear this dream that I dreamed. **7** I imagined we were binding sheaves in the middle of the plain, and my sheaf rose and stood upright; then your sheaves, turning around, did obeisance to my sheaf.” **8** And his brothers said to him, “Surely you will not, when reigning, reign over us, or, when exercising dominion, exercise dominion over us?” And they proceeded to **hate** him more because of his dreams and because of his words.

3404. **μισέω**; *miseō, misō*;



Joseph (Genesis 37–50)


- **Despised by his brothers:** Joseph was hated by his brothers because of his dreams (which foretold his future exaltation) and his father's favoritism (Genesis 37:4–11).



- **Betrayed and sold:** They sold him into slavery, effectively rejecting him.
- **Later exalted:** Despite rejection, God raised him up to be second in command in Egypt, using him to save many lives during famine (Genesis 45:7–8).


Connection: Joseph is a type of Christ—rejected by his own people but later exalted to bring salvation.

Isaiah 8:6 “Inasmuch as these people have rejected the gently flowing waters of Shiloah
And rejoice in Rezin and the son of Remaliah;




Genesis 37 – Joseph's Betrayal and Suffering

- Joseph is **betrayed by his brothers**, stripped of his robe, thrown into a pit, and sold into slavery.
- His **suffering is undeserved**, yet he ultimately rises to save many people from famine.
- His story foreshadows the concept of **redemptive suffering** and **God's providence through injustice**.




Jeremiah (Book of Jeremiah)

- **Despised prophet:** Jeremiah was called by God to warn Judah, but the people rejected his message.




- **Persecuted:** He was mocked, beaten, imprisoned, and thrown into a cistern (Jeremiah 20:1–2; 38:6).
- **Weeping prophet:** He grieved over the people's sin and their rejection of God's word.

Connection: Jeremiah prefigures Jesus as a suffering prophet, bearing the burden of divine truth while being scorned by those he tries to help.




Jeremiah 38:8 – Jeremiah in the Pit

- Jeremiah is thrown into a **cistern (pit)** for speaking God's truth. He faces **persecution** and **near death**.
- Ebed-Melech, an Ethiopian eunuch, courageously pleads to the king and **rescues Jeremiah**.
- This mirrors Joseph's pit experience, but here a **righteous outsider** intervenes.
- Jeremiah, like Joseph, **prefigures Christ** in his rejection and eventual vindication.




Jer 38:1...Jeremiah was speaking to all the people, saying, **2** “Thus says the LORD, ‘He who stays in this city will die by the sword and by famine and by pestilence, but he who goes out to the Chaldeans will live and have his own life as booty and stay alive.’ **3** “Thus says the LORD, ‘This city will certainly be given into the hand of the army of the king of Babylon and he will capture it.’”




Jer 38:4 Then the officials said to the king, “Now let this man be put to death, inasmuch as he is discouraging the men of war who are left in this city and all the people, by speaking such words to them; for this man is not seeking the well-being of this people but rather their harm.”

Jeremiah is telling the people of Jerusalem to surrender to the Babylonians, because resisting will lead to destruction. This message:




Contradicted the national hope for deliverance

Sound familiar



Was seen as demoralizing and even treasonous

Seemed anti-God to many, since Jerusalem was viewed as God's city




Yeshua (Gospels; esp. Isaiah 53 and John 1)

- **Despised and rejected:** Isaiah 53:3 prophetically describes the Messiah as "despised and rejected by men."
- **Rejected by his own:** John 1:11 says, "He came to his own, and his own people did not receive him."
- **Crucified:** Ultimately, Yeshua was handed over to be crucified despite his innocence, fulfilling the pattern of the righteous sufferer.

Connection: Yeshua is the fulfillment of the pattern seen in Joseph and Jeremiah—God's chosen one, rejected by men, but ultimately exalted and used by God for redemption.

John 19:1 – 20:10 – Jesus' Passion and Resurrection

- Jesus is **falsely accused**, **beaten**, and **crucified**—the ultimate unjust suffering.
- He is stripped of his clothing (John 19:23–24), echoing Joseph's stripped robe.
- Jesus is buried in a **tomb** (a type of “pit”), but rises again—**not just rescued, but resurrected**.
- Mary Magdalene and the disciples find the tomb **empty** (John 20:1–10), signaling victory over death and sin.




Let's look deeper

These passages together illustrate a **pattern of redemptive suffering**:

- The **righteous one suffers** unjustly.
- That suffering leads to a **greater purpose**—salvation, truth, or redemption.
- God **vindicates** the sufferer.

This pattern is clearest in Yeshua, but is **foreshadowed** in both Joseph and Jeremiah.




Some people draw a theological parallel: just as Joseph, Jeremiah, and Jesus were rejected, the Jewish people as a whole have often been rejected or misunderstood by the world.

Biblical Themes Supporting the Connection:

Chosen but Opposed

Israel was chosen to be a light to the nations (Isaiah 49:6), yet faced opposition.




Suffering Servant Nation

Some interpret Isaiah 53 (commonly applied to Jesus) as also reflecting Israel's suffering through history.

Enduring Purpose

Paul says in Romans 11 that “the gifts and the calling of God are irrevocable” — referring to Israel.




Zechariah 10:3–5 — Judah as God's Warhorse

"The LORD of hosts will care for His flock, the house of Judah... From them will come the cornerstone... From Judah will come the battle bow... They shall be like mighty men in battle."

This is military imagery:

God uses Judah as a war bow and weapon.

Judah is portrayed as God's instrument of victory.




End-Times Warfare — Judah Involved in God's Judgment

In passages like Zechariah 12:2–6, Judah becomes a key part of God's final defense of Jerusalem:


"In that day I will make the clans of Judah like a blazing pot... they shall devour... all the surrounding peoples."
